### OPEN ANNOUNCEMENT FOR THE COLLECTION OF EXPRESSION OF INTEREST IN HOSTING EU GREEN FELLOW ACADEMICS FOR SHORT TEACHING ASSIGNMENTS

#### 1. Hosting Teaching Staff from EU GREEN Partner Universities

As part of the EU GREEN Alliance's ongoing commitment to fostering a shared European academic space, we are pleased to announce the Collection of Interest to Host Teaching Mobilities for the 2025/2026 academic year.

This initiative is designed to enhance inter-university collaboration and facilitate the exchange of knowledge across the Alliance. It aims to promote innovative and interdisciplinary teaching practices, while offering students enriching international academic experiences and diverse perspectives. Through this effort, we seek to contribute to the



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development of a European university campus founded on the principles of sustainability, inclusion, and academic excellence.

## 1.1 Eligibility for submitting an expression of interest

Each Course Unit Coordinator or Assistant<sup>1</sup> from an EU GREEN University who teaches in a university course is eligible to initiate the process.

The expression of interest is submitted and registered as part of an EU GREEN university structure seeking incoming academics for short teaching assignments.

## 1.2 Required Information and Application Procedure

Beginning on **1<sup>st</sup> December 2025**, academic staff from all EU GREEN partner universities are invited to express their interest in hosting colleagues from the Alliance for short-term teaching visits by completing the designated online application.

### FORM

Expressions of interest will be accepted and collected on a continuous basis throughout the 2025/2026 academic year, until **30<sup>th</sup> September 2026**. All mobilities will have to be completed by no later than **31<sup>st</sup> December 2026**.

Submissions will contribute to the development of a shared EU GREEN Teaching Opportunities Dashboard, hosted on the EU GREEN web portal and accessible to all member universities. This platform will enable interested academic staff from an EU GREEN partner institution to explore available teaching opportunities and submit applications by getting in touch with the proposing colleague.

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<sup>1</sup> Course Unit Coordinator: The academic staff member responsible for the overall design, delivery, and assessment of a specific course unit. Course Unit Assistant: The supporting academic or teaching staff member who assists the Course Unit Coordinator in delivering the course.



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## 2. The Mobility Application Process

### 2.1 Eligibility for mobility academics

All academic staff members, including professors, lecturers, and researchers with teaching responsibilities who are affiliated with an EU GREEN partner university, are eligible to respond to the published opportunities.

**\*NOTE:** Being selected by a hosting university does not guarantee automatic funding for the chosen mobility. Please contact your competent office to confirm how the mobility will be funded (see the 'Contacts' section below).

Each teaching mobility may last between a minimum of 2 and a maximum of 60 days, with a minimum of 8 lecture hours. Please note that universities will fund only mobilities with a duration of between 2 and 7 days; any additional days will not be covered. Potential mobility academics must contact their competent office to obtain information about the minimum number of teaching hours required by the programme funding the mobility.

### 2.2 Selection and Matching Process

The academic offering the teaching assignment is responsible for selecting and/or accepting the candidate for the mobility. This acceptance does not entail any financial obligation, as the competent office of the selected academics retains full responsibility for funding (which may be available under the ERASMUS+ STA framework or other sources).

Please kindly note that **the conditions of mobility are agreed upon by the parties involved.**



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Teaching mobilities are scheduled based on mutual interest, availability and agreement, in accordance with mobility regulations and institutional procedures.

Mobilities may take place either in the framework of the ERASMUS+ STA Action or in any other eligible framework identified by the competent office of the mobility teacher's home University. The deriving regulations and conditions apply.

All the mobilities must take place in the period between **1<sup>st</sup> January 2026 and 31<sup>st</sup> December 2026**.

### 2.3 Mobility Funding

Selected mobilities will be financed through ERASMUS+ STA funds, or alternatively through EU GREEN funds or other internal mobility funds, depending on the funding opportunities available at the home institution of the selected professor.

Mobility costs will be covered by the home university of the selected teaching staff member. If different conditions apply, it is the responsibility of the parties involved to specify the financial arrangements available.

The following table provides clarification and details. Please find below the number of Erasmus+ STA mobility slots made available by each EU GREEN university as a sending institution for the coverage of mobilities arising from this announcement.
